

Ross on Wye Walkers are Welcome

Peterstow - Bridstow Orchard Loop Walk

A stile-free walk along public footpaths and quiet lanes. This walk takes in some of the old cider orchards, with its autumn apples and spring blossom, which are still used to make award-winning cider at Broome Farm.

Parking/Start: Yew Tree Inn car park

Distance: 2.5 miles

Grade: Easy, no stiles

New gates provided by the two Parish Councils and the Ross-on-Wye Walkers are Welcome Group have helped create an easy 2.5 miles walk in beautiful countryside. Suitable footwear is essential as it can be wet around the Wells Brook.

The walk is accessible by using the 33 bus from Ross-on-Wye and alighting at the Yew Tree Inn. The route is well way-marked.



Leave the Yew Tree car park, cross the A49 and turn left towards Floss. Just past the entrance to the Caravan Park re-cross the A49 and enter the field through the kissing gate. Continue downhill through 3 more gates to reach Wells Brook Lane and turn left. Walk along the Lane to reach Broome Farm and turn into the farm drive. Follow the track bearing right away from the farm buildings through the cider orchard until you reach the lane leading back to the A49.


On reaching the A49 turn left and almost immediately cross the A49 to enter the lane leading to Peterstow Common. Walk along the lane over the Common to High Town and turn left. Continue along this lane until you reach a wooden gate on the left (just as the lane turns sharp right). Go through the gate and follow the field-edge path to Peterstow Court. This footpath provides great views across the Wye Valley to the hills to the east. Leave the field by another wooden gate opposite Peterstow Court and turn left along the lane back to the A49. Another left turn returns you to the Yew Tree Inn.

Parking at The Yew Tree Inn with refreshments available from midday.

Lunches, tea, coffee and cake available.

The local Broome Farm cider can be bought from the Yew Tree Inn shop
